# **ITINERARY**

### Day One – Tuesday, June 18, 2024

Our journey begins with an afternoon flight out of Washington Dulles Airport to Copenhagen, Denmark.

### Day Two – Wednesday, June 19

Welcome to wonderful, wonderful Copenhagen,

the premier capital of northern Europe and Scandinavia's most fantastic city. Once we clear passport

control and customs, we stop for coffee and a Danish before strolling through Haveselskabets Have, the Garden Association's Garden. Then we're off to downtown Copenhagen for a Canal Cruise and lunch. After checking into our hotel, we go on a walking tour of two urban gardens not far from our hotel: The King's Garden and the Botanical Garden. We also stop briefly at Tage Andersen Florist, close to our hotel. Our hotel is a

repurposed historic spice warehouse, overlooking the old ships of the Nyhavn harbor district. The

interior of the hotel still has exposed wooden beams with thick plaster walls adorned with paintings by prominent Danish artists. We finish the day with a get-acquainted dinner. We stay in Copenhagen for three nights. Lodging: Copenhagen (B)(L)(D)



### Day Three - Thursday, June 20

It's a royal day today as we make our way to North Zealand, an area sometimes described as the Danish Riviera because of its lakes, forests, and beaches. Just to the north of Copenhagen, Zealand also has three royal castles: Fredensborg, followed by Frederiksborg, and finally, Kornborg. Kronborg Castle is well known as the Castle of Elsinore in Shakespeare's Hamlet. Lodging: Copenhagen (B)

### Day Four – Friday, June 21

The country of Denmark is made up of over 1,000 islands, and today we travel westward to the third largest island, Funen. Here we find two excellent gardens: Langeskov Planteskole, an outstanding garden center (where we also have lunch), and then in the afternoon, we see the great gardens of Egeskov Castle with its best-preserved moat in all of Europe. Lodging: Copenhagen (B)(L)

### Day Five – Saturday, June 22

Today we have the day free in Copenhagen to explore this beautiful city on our own. It's a good day to visit the Design Museum of Copenhagen or Tivioli Gardens amusement park. In late afternoon, we depart Copenhagen and cross over the Øresund Bridge into Sweden. Lodging: Malmo (B)

### Day Six – Sunday, June 23

Leaving Malmo, we drive north to Hjarnarp, where

we visit the private garden of Ulf and Lisbeth Jönsson. This hilltop garden displays many wild species with garden sculptures. Afterward we travel to Sofiero Castle in Helsingborg. Sofiero is a garden established by King Gustav VI Adolf at the beginning of the 20th century. It was the summer home for Swedish royalty, featuring thousands of rhododendrons, floral beds, borders and kitchen gardens. In 2010, Sofiero was voted "Europe's Most Beautiful Park." Lodging: Malmo (B)(L)

### Day Seven - Monday, June 24

Today we travel up the southeast coast of Sweden, stopping along the way at three unique gardens. First is Åberg's Garden Cafe for tea and a visit to its garden center. Next, we stop for lunch at a garden

# Day Eight – Tuesday, June 25

Lodging: Kalmar (B)(T)(L)(D)

We explore what may be Sweden's most striking historically significant building: the bay-and-moatringed Kalmar Castle. As we tour the castle's interior and beautiful grounds, we learn about Sweden's 16th-century struggle for independence from the Danes. Our final destination of the day is the city of Stockholm. Lodging: Stockholm (B)(L)

### Day Nine – Wednesday, June 26

This morning we tour Drottningholm Palace and Garden, a UNESCO's World Heritage site. This copy of Versailles is one of the best examples of baroque gardens and architecture outside of France. Afterward, we are off for a guided tour of the Vasa Museum, which displays the Vasa, the only intact 17th-century ship that has ever been salvaged. She sank on her maiden voyage in

1628. Our coach takes us to the harbor for an exciting and delicious Archipelago Dinner Cruise. Lodging: Stockholm (B)(D)

### Day Ten – Thursday, June 27

Allotment gardens are found throughout Europe as a result of food shortages following World War II. These are small plots of land leased to individuals and families where they can cultivate gardens and even build garden cottages and other structures. Tanto Gardens is a large allotment garden and is our first visit

of the day. Here we see how Swedes enjoy the fruits of their gardens. After our visit to Tanto, we visit Rosendals Trädgård. You have the remainder of the afternoon free. Lodging: Stockholm (B)

### Day Eleven - Friday June 28

This morning we take a short flight from Stockholm to Oslo, arriving in time for an afternoon walking tour of Oslo's historic city center, followed by free time. Our hotel is located close to the Central Train Station and the Oslo Opera House. Lodging: Oslo (B)

### Day Twelve – Saturday, June 29

Our day in Oslo begins with a visit to the Viking Ship Museum to see the world's best-

preserved Viking ships along with other finds from Viking tombs found in the Oslo Fjord. Fjords are geologic formations created by glaciers. These 'U' shaped valleys are said to be as deep as the surrounding mountains are high. Norway has some of the most beautiful fjords in the world. Later we are off to the University Botanical Garden. The remainder of the afternoon is free for you to enjoy Oslo. Lodging: Oslo (B)

### Day Fourteen - Monday, July1

Our hotel is located right in the harbor of Bergen and we start the day with a walking tour of this beautiful port city. We visit the harbor area and then take a funicular to the top of Mount Floien for a panoramic view of the city. You have the afternoon free to shop or explore Bergen on your own. Lodging: Bergen (B)(D)

### Day Thirteen – Sunday, June 30

Buckle up as we take the fantastic 'Norway in a Nutshell' tour that starts in Oslo and ends in Bergen. Along the way, we take three train rides, a boat ride through fjords, and a scenic coach ride. Our luggage is shipped to our hotel in Bergen so we can fully enjoy this incredible journey, considered one of the finest scenic tours in all of Europe. Lodging: Bergen (B)
